January 17 also marks Benjamin Franklin's birthday, our school patron who understood the need for reform of the criminal justice system. With other Philadelphians, he helped create the Philadelphia Society for Alleviating the Miseries of Public Prisons (now the Pennsylvania Prison Society), the oldest organization in the country dedicated to sensible and humane criminal justice.
